## PHILLIPS FOUNDATION GRANTS \$750,000 TO ADDRESS SYSTEMIC FAMILY POVERTY

Funds to extend the reach of United Way of Greater Greensboro's Family Success Center

**GREENSBORO, N.C.** (August 25, 2015) – Phillips Foundation today announced a \$750,000 grant to United Way of Greater Greensboro's Family Success Centers to help low-income families break the generational cycle of poverty and overcome barriers to financial stability and independence. The grant will more than double the number of families served through the Family Success Centers.

The Family Success Center pilot program, housed at Guilford Child Development, currently serves 41 families in the 27406 zip code, with a plan to serve a total of 100 families by June 2016. Phillips Foundation's contribution will allow United Way to launch three more centers in other low-income zip codes over the next 36-48 months.

In 2015, approximately 20 percent of Greensboro residents live in poverty. The Family Success Center is a collaborative initiative led by United Way of Greater Greensboro and 17 current partner community organizations to address this community issue. The program assists families who live at or below the federal poverty line by offering resources such as job training, educational development and financial literacy in a one-stop location. The families involved meet with case managers who help them develop and implement personalized plans for financial security and sustainable success.

"Phillips Foundation is happy to get behind United Way's streamlined focus and family wellness approach to eliminating poverty in Greensboro," said Elizabeth Carlock Phillips, executive director of the Phillips Foundation. "This pilot program's method is targeted, cohesive, collaborative, and outcomedriven. We look forward to this initiative affecting positive change throughout our community."

"Phillips Foundation's grant provides critical funding for implementing this life-changing program and reaching more families in need," said Michelle Gethers-Clark, president and CEO of United Way of Greater Greensboro. "The donation will extend and strengthen the resources available to participants to better prepare them for financial independence. We plan to leverage the success of this pilot program by identifying best practices and expanding the model to additional Greensboro communities."
